SCHOOL PROCEDURES FOLLOWING ADMINISTRATION OF BOTOX, ANAESTHETIC AND AFTER PUPIL ADMISSION TO HOSPITAL

As you are all aware our school caters for pupils with complex needs. Our school procedures are always in the best interest of our pupils.

Following administration of Botox and anaesthetic for medical intervention, pupils must remain at home for 48 hours.

Upon discharge from the hospital, providing the stay in hospital was not of a long duration, again pupils must remain home for 48 hours. Should your son/daughter be in hospital for a long period of time or for significant surgery the time to recuperate at home will be discussed with the Complex Nursing Team and School, again in the best interest and well-being of your son/daughter.

This is the decision made by the school strategic team, which includes Neil Griffiths (Chair of Governors) and Amanda Marlow (Designated Safeguarding Governor), in conjunction with the Complex Nursing Team and the Governing Body.

At The Redway School, we always endeavour to ensure that the best possible education and care is provided for all our pupils with a special focus on their well-being, hence the reason for the above procedures being absolutely necessary.
